What is a Spelling Bee?

A Spelling Bee is an oral spelling competition which is open to all students in the school in Years 3

- 6. A modified Spelling Bee for the Years K - 2 focuses on both written and oral spelling.

Purpose:

- To encourage students to focus on the importance and relevance of strong spelling skills when writing.
- To assist in developing vocabulary, learn new concepts and build confidence in reading and writing.
- To develop correct pronunciation of words and confidence when speaking especially when using less familiar words.

The Spelling Bee will take place across the school in week 9. The week after next.

ADVENT

On **Sunday 1 December** we will begin a new season in our Liturgical Calendar. We begin our preparations for the birth of **Our Lord**, Jesus. Advent is a Latin word that actually means "coming." In the Catholic Church, Advent is a time of preparation and waiting for the birth of Jesus. Advent officially begins four Sundays before Christmas. During this time we will see an Advent wreath in the Church. The wreath typically consists of greenery with four candles, three purple and one pink. Each candle on the Advent Wreath has a specific meaning:

- Candle one (purple) represents **hope**. It is often called the prophets' candle.
- Candle two (purple) represents **peace**. It is often called the angels' candle.
- Candle three (pink) represents joy. It is often called the shepherds' candle.
- Candle four (purple) represents **love**. It is often called the Bethlehem candle.



The colour that is used during this time is purple. While we are waiting for the birth of Jesus we pray, give thanks to God and focus on how we can be more like Mary by saying, "Yes" to God.

- Or if you can't commit but have some free time, even if just for an hour, contact the canteen and let them know.


