RELIGIOUS EDUCATION MODULE: YEAR 3—FIRST EUCHARIST AND THE MASS

In this module students will explore Jesus' real presence with us when we participate and share in the celebration of the Eucharist and the way its various parts form a cohesive whole. Students are introduced to the way various ministries and roles within the celebration contribute to full and active participation.



Students will identify with and describe the words and actions of the priest during the Eucharistic prayer. Students will explain messages of key scripture passages and their relationship to understanding the Sacrament of Eucharist. Students will explore how we prepare for and receive our First and subsequent Communion.



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












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
